
#### **Special Guest at our March Meeting**

## **Website Tip of the Month: Trouble Shooting the Registration Process**

Thought you registered but then find you are not on the registration list for an event? How do you know you registered? When you register for an event, you almost immediately receive a confirmation email. You

should always check your email to ensure you received a confirmation email after registering for an event. If an event has fees, you will also be emailed a receipt.

#### What should I do if I didn't receive a confirmation email?


- 1. If you did not receive the email, first check your SPAM folder or if you use Gmail, check the PROMOTIONS folder.
- 2. Go to the event from the calendar and check the registration page. If you are registered you will see a comment. <u>Already registered</u> under the Register button. You can also check the registration list by clicking the link showing the number of registrants.



screen. See the figure below.




2. Ensure you continue through all the screens until you reach the confirmation screen and click on the **CONFIRM** button.




