





# Website Tip of the Month: Online Payment Tips

Did you know that you have 15 minutes to have your credit card successfully processed while registering for a social event? If it is not processed in this time frame, your registration will be automatically cancelled by the system. Below are some tips to aid your online payments.

- 1. All fields must match the information the credit card company has on file for the card. You may pay with anyone's credit card, such as a spouse, but all the information entered must match their card, including name.
- 2. The postal code should be entered without a blank e.g. A1B2C3
- 3. If you miss entering one of the fields, you will get a red error message under the missing information.
- 4. If your card is denied, you will receive an error message: e.g., **Card Expired**. Re-enter the information carefully, correcting any errors, or use another credit card.
- 5. Never try to re-register for the event if you have problems without checking your profile for an unpaid invoice. Go to your profile by clicking on the blue head and then click **View Profile**. Invoices with open balances (unpaid or partially paid) will be shown at the top of the Invoices and payments screen.

- 6. From here, click **Please pay online** and enter the credit card information again carefully, or use another credit card.
- 7. If you do not see an outstanding invoice or balance due information, you should go back to the event registration. Check to see if your registration was cancelled. Check the list of names by clicking on the number of registrants. If 15 minutes has passed and your registration was automatically cancelled, you may register again.


