

# **Speaker for September**

Dan Buchanan, aka "The History Guy of Brighton", is a historian, genealogist, storyteller and author. He acts as a history consultant for the community, engaging in many activities from researching the early history of the area to telling history stories both virtually and in person.

His topic will deal with the HMS Speedy, a British gunboat that was lost in



a storm near Presqu'ile Point in 1804 with no survivors or wreckage to be found. His book "The Wreck of HMS Speedy: The Tragedy That Shook Upper Canada" tells the story of the ship and the people who were lost. It



paints a vivid picture of Upper Canada only ten years into its life, including the growing conflicts between government, settlers and the Indigenous people who occupied the land. In the final chapters, it provides a glimpse into the mystery that pervades the story of HMS Speedy, the diving and exploration in the 1990s and the potential for further study of

artifacts that might be from the ship.





# Website Tip of the Month: Member Forum

We Want to Hear from You

The Member Forum was created several years ago so our members could create and reply to questions or topics that are posted by other members. You may also use the Member Forum to post requests for carpooling. Below are instructions to create a post.

- 1. Log on to the website.
- On the MEMBER PAGES landing page, you will see New <u>Member Forum Topics</u> in the green box. Click on the title <u>Member Forum Topics</u> which will link you to the MEMBER FORUM page. (You may also access the page through the MEMBER PAGES sub menu or the site map, the large pumpkin coloured box located at the bottom of the page).
- 3. Click on the **CREATE TOPIC** Button.

4. The **CREATE TOPIC** form will appear and is similar to an email. In the subject box, type in your subject. If it is a carpool request, ensure you add the event name in the subject and you are looking for carpooling with someone. In the **Body** box, type in your message.
